

Compton, innholder, sold land in Little Compton to Job Briggs. On 7 Aug. 1729, ack. 5 July 1733, William Soule of Little Compton, weaver, and wife Rachel, sold land in Little Compton to John Gifford.

On 8 March 1730/1, William Soule of Tiverton, weaver, sold land in Tiverton to Philip Taber.

On 29 Oct. 1734 Rachel Sole, widow, was made executrix of the estate of William Sole of Tiverton. The estate included lands in Tiverton and Dartmouth. She rendered her account 18 Nov. 1735.

121 **HANNAH⁴ SOULE** (William³, George²⁻¹) b. Dartmouth 1 June 1694; d. prob. Dartmouth ca. 1738 and prob. before 21 Feb 1738/9 (deed).

She m. ca. 1724 **JOSEPH HOLLEY/HOLWAY**, b. Sandwich 6 Nov. 1694; d. prob. Dutchess Co. NY ca. 1770 (tax); son of Joseph and Anne (Jennings) Holway.

The will of Joseph Holway, of Sandwich, made 24 Oct. 1732 and proved 4 Dec. 1732, names wife Anne, sons Gideon and Joseph, and daughters Reliance, Mary, Anne and Meribah.

On 21 Feb. 1738/9, 20 Aug. 1739, 22 Sept. 1739 and 25 April 1741 Joseph Holley of Dartmouth, yeoman, sold land in Dartmouth. No wife is mentioned.

On 22 Nov. 1740 Joseph Holway of Bristol Co. MA gave a bond to Samuel Holway of Beekman Precinct, Dutchess Co. NY. On 12 July 1743 Joseph Holway had been taken into custody by the sheriff of Dutchess Co. as the bond had not been paid.

On 31 Dec. 1741 Joseph Holaway, late of Dartmouth, now living in "Outer Shore" in "Duch county in New England," husbandman, sold to Henry Gidley land in Dartmouth. Oustershore in Dukes Co. NY was an area in Pawling, Beekman Patent, and thus called in the 1740s.

Joseph Holway was taxed in Beekman Precinct, Dutchess Co. NY from 1741

through 1769 and in Pawling NY for 1770.

On 12 Aug. 1751 Joseph Holway complained in Dutchess Co. NY that John Hamblin had not repaid a note of 15 May 1750.

122 **GEORGE⁴ SOULE** (William³, George²⁻¹) b. Dartmouth 5 Oct. 1695; d. Great Nine Partners, Dutchess Co. NY ca. Feb. 1784.

He m. prob. Dartmouth before 18 11mo 1719 **LYDIA HOWLAND**, b. Dartmouth 11 Oct. 1701; d. Dutchess Co. NY after 1776; daughter of Benjamin and Judith (Samson) Howland. The will of Benjamin Howland of Dartmouth, dated 5 March 1721/2 and proved 21 March 1726/7, names wife Judith; sons Barnabas and Isaac Howland; and [daughters] Abigail Richardson, Desire Howland and "Lidiah Howland now wife of George Soule;" brother Nicholas Howland and friend John Russell.

George Soule is of Little Compton for a 7 Aug. 1733 deposition in which he mentions his brother Joseph Soule "before he went to Caroline which was about two years past;" Peter Coffin of Nantucket; a Mr. Hix; and brother Benjamin Soule.

In 1741 George Soule and wife Lydia sold land in Dartmouth.

On 19 8mo 1741 at Dartmouth MM George Soule and wife were given certificate to go to Mamaroneck MM "in the Government of New York." Lydia visited Dartmouth MM with a certificate 19 9mo 1744 and again 21 8mo 1751.

George Soule was taxed at Nine Partners NY Feb. 1741 - 1772.
